The Community Foundation of Burke County is pleased to announce the 2014 Community Grants Cycle. Community Grants allow CFBC to make grants to tax-exempt, 501(c)(3) organizations that have programs benefiting the residents of Burke County.

Those interested are asked to visit the CFBC website at www.cfburkecounty.org, click on Grants, and carefully read the guidelines prior to applying. This year, CFBC has implemented the Foundant Online Grant Management System. All Letters of Intent, Grant Applications and required follow-up will now be done online.

To apply for a grant, applicants must submit a Letter of Intent to CFBC before 5 p.m. on June 30.

If a proposal meets CFBC requirements and is considered to be of critical importance to the Burke County community, a Grant Application will be made available to the organization for completion. All Grant Applications must be received before 5

p.m. July 25.

The mission of CFBC is to encourage, develop and participate in philanthropy by providing flexible giving opportunities, professional support and responsible stewardship for the benefit of donors and qualified recipients.

CFBC is a vehicle through which individuals, families,

businesses and organizations are able to create permanent, longterm funds to address a broad spectrum of community needs.
