Paul Cranford has established the Cranford Scholarship Endowment Fund in memory of Eric and Fred Cranford, Eric Cranford served in the United States Navv and

was killed in the Pentagon attack on Sept. 11, 2001. Fred Cranford was a teacher at Drexel High School and served as an associate superintendent for the Burke County Public School System. This scholarship is open to graduating seniors from East Burke High School and Jimmy S. Draughn High School. It was created to provide needed financial resources to obtain a higher education. In establishing the Cranford Scholarship Endowment Fund, Paul Cranford expressed his desire that applicants demonstrate financial need, academic ability and strong leader-

ship potential.
