The group welcomed home one of its natives, Kesha Nichols, as guest speaker. Born and raised in Burke County, Nichols discovered her passion for dance at Sherri's School of Dance. After receiving a degree in dance education, Nichols headed to New York City to pursue her dreams. She has established her own dance company, performed in numerous productions, and was a cast member of the TV show "Basketball Wives." Nichols is a national speaker who focuses on promoting awareness of the bullying epidemic and the empowerment that can come from embracing one's multicultural background. The group's goal is to improving the lives of women and their families in Burke County.
